(excuse me please for my poor English)

If you want to protect your **SQL Source Code** (i.e. **Stored Procedures** and **Triggers**) in your InterBase Data Bases, then you have to do the following:

```
UPDATE RDB$PROCEDURES  
SET RDB$PROCEDURE_SOURCE = NULL  
WHERE RDB$SYSTEM_FLAG = 0;
```



RDB\$SYSTEM\_FLAG = 0

OR

```
UPDATE RDB$TRIGGERS  
SET RDB$TRIGGER_SOURCE = NULL  
WHERE RDB$SYSTEM_FLAG IS NULL;
```



RDB\$SYSTEM\_FLAG IS NULL

That's all!

### Warning

If you execute the following SQL sentence:

```
UPDATE RDB$PROCEDURES  
SET RDB$PROCEDURE_BLR = NULL;
```
